3. Write two assignments (about 1,500 words each), one from each of the two sections. (Please write the entire question as the heading on your paper.)

<u>Section One:</u> Write an essay on an aspect of your experience or anticipated experience as a SG leader. Although you write from your experience, you must also reflect from the two books (or other theories, principles, practices, etc. from other books you have read), and the input from the lectures.

- a) i) Describe your current practices/roles as a SG leader. Give a critique of yourself as a SG leader. What are the areas you would like to improve as a result of both the lectures and the two books (or more) you have read? ii) What are your joys and pains as a SG leader? If there were little or no joys in being a SG leader or if the ministry is becoming a burden, what would you do? Will you still be a SG leader or give up; why?
- b) Is the SG meeting you attend/lead well prepared in all its segments using 4Ws, ASAP or any other format? Briefly describe them. How will you or the SG leader prepare to lead the meeting? If some segments of the meeting are delegated to others, how would you ensure that the entire SG meeting is well executed and well coordinated?
- c) Describe the stage (of the group dynamic) your SG is in. Bearing in mind your ultimate goal is to grow and multiply your SG, what should the SG leader be doing now to move forward the SG? What other SG dynamics are there that needs to happen or stop?
- d) What can you say about the quality of caring in your SG? Does caring happen spontaneously or is it planned carefully? What can the SG leader do to ensure that you meet the care needs of your SG members? How would you motivate your members to care for each other?
- e) How does your SG reach out to their non-Christian families and friends, ministry needs of your church, or the communities in our society? If you do, evaluate the result and suggest improvements. If your SG does not, what does the SG leader need to do to bring about the change in doing outreach?

Section Two:

- a) What applications can we make from Wesley's practice of small groups (societies, classes, bands, select societies, and penitent bands) into today's small group as practiced in our churches? (You need to be sensitive to the contexts.)
- b) What is your own philosophy of small group ministry? To what extend do you agree (or disagree) with what is presented in the lectures in module 1(basis, values, structure and goals)? In particular, comment on (i) the format of ASAP (as opposed to the commonly held 4Ws), (ii) how well you think the segment on Accountability will be received by our SG members, and (iii) whether it is too demanding to expect the SG leader to do all that is taught in the lectures?
- c) Assuming that you want to promote SG ministry to the entire membership of your church, how will you go about? In particular, (i) what will you share with your pastor what you see needs to be done, (ii) what would you want to see the SG Committee do (See Section XI. Membership/ Cell/Parish/Small Groups, paragraph. 142 on page 60 of the 2008 *The Book of Discipline*), (iii) what would you do personally?
